Highlights for Lincoln County Schools

- No Low Performing Schools
- 1st “A” School – Rock Springs Elementary
- 90.4% of schools met or exceeded growth
- 4 year graduation rate at 90.8%
- 3rd in Region based on Student Achievement
- 16th out of 115 LEAs based on Proficiency
- 15th out of 115 LEAs based on Growth



Highlights for Lincoln Charter School

- Lincoln Charter serves over 2000 students at the Denver and Lincolnton campuses
- Class of 2017:
 - 146 Graduates- largest graduating class in Lincoln Charter history
 - Graduation Cohort Rate- 100%
 - 704 college/university acceptances & over \$19 million in merit aid offers
 - 18% of graduates entered post secondary as first generation college students
 - Seniors documented over 21,000 service hours, while at Lincoln Charter

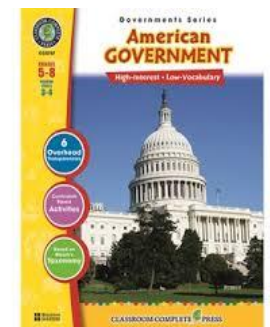

How Much Would the $\frac{1}{4}$ Cent Sales Tax Cost the Individual?

Taxable Goods = Sales Tax

\$100 purchase = 25 cents

\$300 purchase = 75 cents

\$500 purchase = \$1.25
