Good evening Lincoln County Schools' parents,

This call is to inform you of revisions made to LCS Board Policy 3450 impacting all Freshmen starting high school during 2018 - 2019 and beyond.

The student who has the highest weighted grade point average at the end of the senior year and who has been in membership in Lincoln County Schools for the last four semesters of the student's high school career shall receive the designation of Valedictorian.

The student who has the second highest weighted grade point average at the end of the senior year and who has been in membership in Lincoln County Schools for the last four semesters of the student's high school career shall receive the designation of Salutatorian.

For freshman entering 2018-2019 and beyond, there will be one valedictorian for each school. The valedictorian shall be the senior student with the highest weighted grade point average at the end of the fourth marking period of their senior year. In the event of a tie, the valedictorian will be determined by the highest cumulative unweighted grade point average. If a tie still exists, the valedictorian will be determined by calculating student course final averages which they received credit for on their transcript during the student's freshman, sophomore, junior, and senior year. The salutatorian shall be the senior student with the second highest grade point average using the same determination.
